**Essay Contest**

**Purpose of Award:** Sylvia Myers established a history award in honor of her late husband, Nicholas G. Myers to commemorate Nick's devotion to passing on his knowledge and passion for local history to successive generations.

**The winner will:**

- ✓ receive a cash award in the amount of \$200
- ✓ be presented with a certificate at a North Light event in May 2010
- ✓ have his/her name engraved on the Mr. Nick Plaque
- ✓ have his/her name and winning essay posted on North Light's website
- ✓ have his/her winning essay printed in the Review newspaper.

**NOTE:** A 2<sup>nd</sup> essay will receive honorable mention and cash award of \$25 from the Christopher Coady Fund. The winning student's recommending teacher will receive a \$50 gift certificate for use at Staples.

**Essays will be judged based on:**

- ✓ Originality, content, clarity of expression, grammar & mechanics
- ✓ Adhering to the rules of the contest as follows:
- ✓ Essays must:
  - discuss a person/s, place/s or event/s significant to the history of the 21<sup>st</sup> Ward of Philadelphia
  - be written in English
  - be legible - neatly printed by hand or typed and double spaced
  - contain between 300 to 500 words and submissions must include the number of words recorded at the end of the essay
  - include a list of resources
  - contain original composition; plagiarism will result in disqualification.
- ✓ Contestants must:
  - be an 8<sup>th</sup> grade or high school student who resides in a primary residence in zip codes 19127/28 OR attends a school located in zip codes 19127/28.
  - attach a 3x5 index card containing the name of the contestant, home address with zip code, telephone number/s with area code, name of school, grade in school
  - submit the recommendation form (on opposite side, may also be copied) completed by a teacher or counselor at the school that he/she attends.
- ✓ Visuals (photos, maps, etc.) may be included, but no more than two pages in addition to written submission.
- ✓ All required materials must be submitted in hardcopy (no fax or email copies will be accepted) to North Light Community Center, 175 Green Lane, Philadelphia, PA 19127 on or before 5:00pm on Tuesday, April 13, 2010. If submissions are mailed, the envelope must be postmarked no later than Friday, April 9, 2010 and contestants should request a return receipt.

All essays submitted become the property of North Light Community Center and will not be returned.
